PREPOSITIONS OF TIME

REMEMBER:

- **AT** before The time for example 9:20, celebrations for example CHRISTMAS, CARNIVAL, expressions such as NIGHT, MIDDAY, MIDNIGHT, SUNSET, SUNRISE, THE WEEKEND.
- **ON** before Days of the week, Dates, expressions such as BIRTHDAY, HOLIDAYS, WEEKDAYS.
- **IN** before Seasons of the year, Months, Years, Centuries, expressions such as MORNINGS, AFTERNOONS, EVENINGS.
