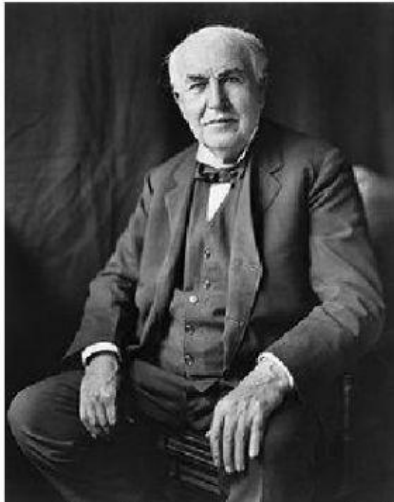

Ada Lovelace

Ada Byron _____ (be born) in London on 10 December, 1815. She _____ (be) the daughter of the famous British poet, Lord Byron and his wife, Annabella. Five weeks later, her parents _____ (separate). Her mother _____ (not want) Ada to be a poet like her father, so she _____ (teach) her Maths and Science. Ada was a Maths genius but she also had her father's imagination.

In 1828, when she was only thirteen, Ada _____ (design) a flying machine. Then, when she was eighteen, Ada _____ (meet) the inventor, Charles Babbage. She _____ (help) him with his work and he had a big influence on her life.

Ada _____ (marry) Lord Lovelace in 1835 and they _____ (have) three children. After that, she _____ (work) with Babbage on his new calculating machine. In 1843, she _____ (write) an article about it with a plan for calculating numbers. This plan was the first computer program.

Ada _____ (have) an important influence on computer history because she _____ (predict) the modern computer. In 1980, when American scientists _____ (invent) a new computer language, they called it ADA. Ada _____ (die) on 27 November, 1852, at the age of 36.



Elvis Presley

Elvis Presley _____ (be) one of the most popular singers of his time. He was called 'The King of Rock 'n' Roll' and almost thirty years after his death, people still listen to his music.

Elvis Aaron Presley _____ (be born) on 8th January, 1935, in Mississippi, USA. He _____ (win) a singing contest at the age of six and played his first guitar at the age of eleven. As a young man,

Elvis _____ (work) as a lorry driver before he became a singer.

He _____ (have) his first hit, 'Heartbreak Hotel', in 1956. In the same year, he _____ (make) his first film, 'Love me Tender'. In 1958, Elvis _____ (join) the army and went to Germany. There he _____ (meet) Priscilla Beaulieu. They _____ (marry) in 1967. Elvis _____ (become) one of the richest singers in history. During his lifetime he _____ (record) a large number of songs and many of them were big hits. He _____ (perform) his last concert on 26th June, 1977.

Sadly, Elvis _____ (die) a few months later on 16th August. He was only 42 years old. 'The King' is dead, but his legend lives on!

He also _____ (work) as a military engineer and _____ (be) a good musician. When he was a child, Leonardo _____ (like) school but he _____ (hate) Latin. In 1466, Leonardo's family _____ (move) to Florence and he _____ (finish) school. In 1482, he _____ (move) to Milan and _____ (start) to work for the Duke of Milan. He _____ (design) many buildings for the Duke. He also _____ (study) mathematics. His drawing of the *Anatomy of a Man* _____ (show) him to be a great biologist. In 1502, he _____ (return) to Florence and _____ (paint) the *Mona Lisa*. From 1514 to 1516, he _____ (live) in Rome and _____ (continue) his scientific experiments. He _____ (die) in France in 1519.
