Unit 5: Future Tense (Will / Won't)

Grammar Note

Past Tense: We use *will* and *won't* to make predictions about the future.

Affirmative (will / 'll)

- Ally will bake the cupcakes tonight.
- You'll study English with Miss Sarah.
- My dad will stop smoking.
- Robots will replace humans in the future.

Negative (will not / won't)

- Ally won't bake the cupcakes tonight.
- You won't study English with Miss Sarah.
- My dad won't stop smoking.
- Robots won't replace humans in the future.

Questions

- Will Ally bake the cupcakes tonight?
- Will you study English with Miss Sarah?
- Will your dad stop smoking?
- Will robots replace humans in the future?

Short Answer

- Yes, she will. / No, she won't.
- Yes, I will. / No, I won't.
- Yes, he will. / No, he won't.
- Yes, they will / No, they won't.
