

Prepositional Phrases

RULES

A **prepositional phrase** is a group of words that begins with a preposition and ends with a noun or pronoun.

My Aunt Libby lives **in a big red farmhouse**.

Aunt Libby often sits **under a big oak tree**.

A prepositional phrase can be used to add more information to a simple sentence.

My aunt writes poems.

My aunt **with the long red hair** writes poems.

My aunt **with the long red hair** writes poems **about nature**.
