Rule 1. Use commas to separate words and word groups in a simple series of three or more items.

Example: My estate goes to my husband, son, daughter-in-law, and nephew.

Rule 2. Use a comma to separate adjectives in noun groups

Example: He is a strong, healthy man.

Rule 3 In sentences where two independent clauses are joined by connectors such as and, or, but, etc., put a comma at the end of the first clause.

Incorrect: He walked all the way home and he shut the door.

Correct: He walked all the way home, and he shut the door.

Some writers omit the comma if the clauses are both quite short:

Example: I paint and he writes.

Rule 4. In complex sentences when the dependent clause comes first.

Example: Before he went to the beach, he grabbed a towel.

Rule 5. Use commas to set off expressions that interrupt the sentence flow (nevertheless, after all, by the way, on the other hand, however, etc.).

He was a great athlete, however, he was a poor sportsman.

I am, by the way, very nervous about this.

Rule 6. Before an apposition or when you add an extra word, phrase or clause to give extra information

Example: My youngest sister, Sally, is an excellent story teller.

John went to the shop, at the end of the street.

Rule 7. After setting the scene

Scene setting words will be a time, place or reason

Example: After 8 o'clock, the electricity will cut out.

The toilets are unusable, enter at your own risk.
