	AFFIRMATIVE	NEGATIVE	INTERROGATIVE
I	am playing	am not playing	Am I playing?
You	are playing	aren't playing	Are you playing?
He/She/It	is playing	isn't playing	Is he playing?
We	are playing	aren't playing	Are we playing?
You	are playing	aren't playing	Are you playing?
They	are playing	aren't playing	Are they playing?

AN ACTION WHICH IS HAPPENING NOW

I am eating an ice - cream now

Present Simple vs Present Continuous

We use the **present simple** for repeated actions or permanent situations.
Phrases with the Present Simple: *usually, always, often, never, every day, etc.*

Usually



He **usually** drives a car.

We use the **present continuous** for temporary actions or actions happening now.
Phrases with the present continuous: *now, at present, today, at the moment, etc.*

Today



Today he **is riding** a bike.
