Fresh Water Report

Question: Where in the world is there fresh water?

Answer: Approximately 70% of the world's fresh water is frozen in the snow and glaciers of Antarctica. Another 30% is located deep underground throughout the Earth. Surprisingly, all the rivers and lakes of the world together contain less than a quarter of 1% of the total amount of available fresh water! So the amount of freshwater available for drinking in the world is actually very small.

Question: Is that enough water for everyone?

Answer: With an ever-growing world population of six billion people, our water supplies are dangerously low. The future looks very uncertain. **1** With that number of people, our water supplies will be overburdened and could possibly run out. Even today in many developing countries, only a very small percentage of people have daily access to clean drinking water. Although it may seem impossible when you look around you, we are running out of water.

Question: What are the causes of a dwindling water supply?

Answer: Careless overuse is one of the primary reasons the world's water supply is decreasing. **2** Washing cars, watering expensive green lawns, throwing away used water that could be recycled for another use are all examples of the way we take our precious water for granted.

Many homes and businesses also have inefficient or broken plumbing systems that leak and waste large amounts of water. If they are not repaired, these leaks can cause serious problems. Irrigation for farming also uses excessive amounts of water. **3** Otherwise a lot of it is wasted.

Question: What can people do to make sure we have enough water?

Answer: There are many ways individuals and society can help conserve water. One way is to simply become more water-conscious and less wasteful. Think before you throw water down

the drain. **4** Spend five minutes in the shower instead of 15. Fill the sink with enough water to rinse the soap off the dishes, but don't leave the water running!

Another good way to save water is to find new and improved ways to clean 'dirty' water. **5** The development of appropriate techniques will take some investment, but it is a very wise decision.

Finally, communities can help by looking for alternative ways of supplying water. **6** This is a simple and inexpensive solution that will save fresh water for other important uses.

In general, people should consider exactly how much water they need and not use even a drop more!
