- affirmative form

*I swim
you swim
he/she/it swims
we/you/they swim*

We add **-es** when a verb ends with: **-o -ch -sh -x -tch -ch**
watch - watches; wash - washes
and **-ies** when a verb ends with 'y' but is preceded by a consonant! > try - he *tries*
