To build up PASSIVE SENTENCES, we need to have this structure:



ACTIVE VOICE	PASSIVE VOICE
PRESENT SIMPLE ACTIVE	PRESENT SIMPLE PASSIVE
It is important who performs the action.	It is focused on the effect of the action/verb or on the object
Subject + verb + object + complement in present	Subject + verb to be + verb in + complement (It was the object) (am/is/are) participle
Mario <u>paints</u> <u>the house</u> in December	<u>The house</u> <u>is painted</u> in December by Mario
