

Commas in a Series

RULES

A **comma** tells the reader to pause between the words that it separates.

Use commas to separate **three** or **more** words in a series.

Do not use a comma after the **last word** in a series.

Amy sketches, draws, and paints pictures of animals.

If three or more words are listed in a sentence, the list is called a series. Commas are used to separate the items in a series.

commas no comma
↓ ↓ ↓
Lee, Amy, and Ben are best friends.
