To Tip Or Not?

Read the following text about Giving Tips then choose the correct words.

Eating out in a foreign country can be a (challenge – interesting – adventure), especially in a (restaurant - house – culture) very different from your own. Ordering unknown dishes and choosing (familiar – exotic – delicious) sounding drinks can be difficult if you don't know what's in them, and then at the end of the meal you have to (know – decide – make) whether to leave a tip or not. You don't want to (offend – leave – make) your hosts, so it's important to know the correct thing to do. In many countries you're supposed to leave a (money – tip – cash) of about 10% of the bill. However, in the USA you're meant to give a tip of 20% or more as (waiters – workers – owners) aren't paid very much. In some countries, such as Germany and Russia, you're not supposed to put the tip on a (credit card – cash – plate), but leave it on the table. This way, your waiter actually (receives – gives – puts) it. However, in Japan and China you're not supposed to give your waiter a tip – they will think it's very (rude – polite – kind).
