## Comparatives of superiority

When we want to *compare* two or more things we use the superlative or comparative.

#### Superlative

Form:

Short adjectives: the +

adjective + -est

Long adjectives: the most +

adjective

Let's see some examples!

- Mark is the <u>prettiest</u> boy in the class.
- Maria is the <u>youngest</u> sister.

### Comparative

Form:

Short adjectives: adjective +

-er + than

Long adjectives: more +

adjective + than

Let's see some examples!

- Isabella is older than Mark.
- The sun is bigger than the Moon.

But there are cases where exceptions occur!

Irregular adjectives		
Adjective	Comparative	Superlative
Good	Better	The best
Bad	worse	The worst
Far	Farther/further	The farthest/ furthest

Let's see some examples!

#### Superlative:

I am the best in Spanish class.

#### Comparative:

 Juan is better student than Sofia.
