Paraphrased and Summarized Material

- You are not required to provide the page number where the ideas are located.
- Cite the name of the author(s), the year of publication, and the page number where the quotation appears in your source.
- Create a block quotation by starting the quotation on a new line and indent five spaces from the margin.
- Use them when the quote has LESS than 40 words.
- Include the author's name and publication year.
- Don't use quotation marks
- Use it when the quote has MORE than 40 words.
- Use quotation marks to indicate where the quoted material begins and ends
