The Globe, the theatre in which many of Shakespeare's greatest plays were staged for the first time, burned to the ground in 1613. More than 300 years later, American actor and director Sam Wanamaker came ¹ _____ with the idea of reconstructing it in its original location. In 1970 he founded the Shakespeare Globe Trust, ² _____ financed, among other things, research into the appearance and structure of the seventeenth-century Globe. The research and fundraising, as well as attempts to acquire the site and to obtain all necessary permissions, took more than twenty years. But ³ _____ Sam Wanamaker's inexhaustible energy and determination, the project might never have been completed. The reconstructed Globe ⁴ _____ built close to the original location, using traditional materials and techniques. Because of modern fire regulations it has more exits than the original building, and fire inspectors only allowed the roof to be made of thatch ⁵ _____ condition that it would be impregnated with fire retardant. Today you can see a Shakespeare play in conditions very similar to those experienced by 17th century audiences, and learn more about how the theatre worked ⁶ _____ visiting the Globe Museum.
