From around 2006, e-books started slowly, with the birth of products like the Sony Reader and a few alternatives, which failed to make much of a dent in the market.

3. Then came Amazon, a company that had already revolutionized the way books were traded all over the world. Its e-reader, the Amazon Kindle, has been improving its sales steadily and might soon reach a *breakthrough* point. In the UK, for example, Kindle e-book sales increased five-fold at the end of 2012 compared with the previous year.

4. The biggest player in the e-book market is, of course, Apple, with its iPad tablet PC that also functions as an e-reader. More than 12.8 million media tablets like the iPad were sold in 2010, a figure which rose dramatically in 2011 and is sure to do the same in 2012. Traditional book sales, on the other hand, declined 13% in 2011.
