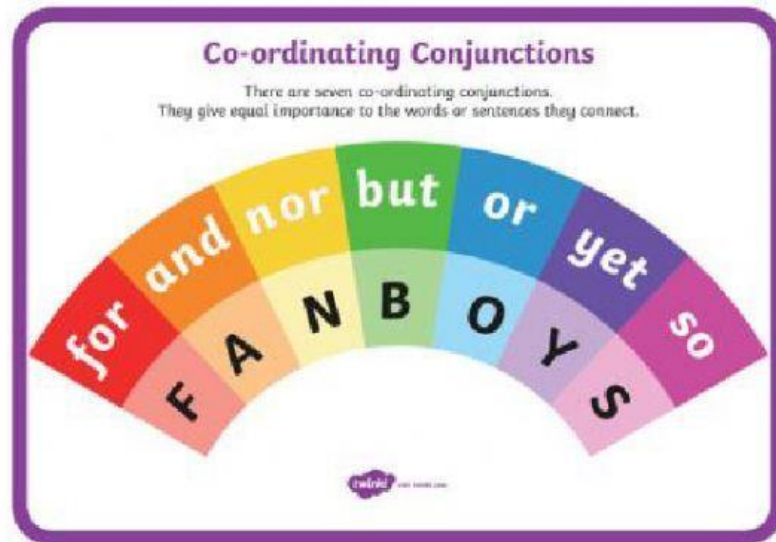


A conjunction or connective is a word that connects parts of a sentence. There are two basic types of conjunctions. They are: **coordinating conjunctions** used to connect two **independent clauses** and **subordinating conjunctions** used to establish the relationship between the dependent clause and the rest of the sentence.
