Pencils of Promise

Thirty-one-year-old Adam Braun was on vacation in India when he met a little boy begging for money in the street. He asked the boy a question: if he could have one thing, what would it be? The child's answer surprised him: a pencil. Adam took out the pencil in his bag and a huge smile crossed the boy's face. In that moment, Adam understood that the boy's happiness was about something more than the small gift. It was about the possibility that the pencil represented. That day, Adam made a promise to himself to help the boy and kids like him go to school. In 2008, he quit his finance job. The next day, he deposited \$25 into a bank account and the nonprofit Pencils of Promise (PoP) was born.

Adam's organization works in the developing world to

build schools and provide educational opportunities. However, PoP is different from traditional charities because most of its income does not come from donations. Adam used his finance experience to build PoP on a business model. That means PoP actually makes money. But, unlike for-profit businesses, all of PoP's profits go to expand its charity activities. So far, PoP has built more than 200 schools across Asia, Africa, and Latin America. On every project, PoP uses local labor and materials, funds scholarships, and provides ongoing teacher training. The aim is to create an organization that will continue to grow in each community and have long-lasting benefits for local businesses, schools, and students. Adam is keeping the promise he made—one pencil at a time.
