1. Destination "We're going to Paris."	1. Benefits "Yogurt is good for your digestion."
2. What time it is "It's a quarter to 2."	2. Period of time "We've lived here for 2 years."
3. Distance "It's about ten miles from my house to the university."	3. Schedule "I made an appointment for May 3."
4. Comparing "I prefer sleeping to working."	4. Agree with "Are you for or against the development of nuclear weapons?"
5. Giving "I gave the book to my sister."	5. Doing something to help someone "Could you carry these books for me?"
6. Motive/Reason – with verb "I came here to see you."	6. Motive/Reason – with noun "Let's go out for a drink."
7. Separate 2 verbs "I want <u>to</u> travel next week"	7. Function – with verb (-ing form) "A ladle is a big spoon used for serving soup."
