Use TO In These Cases:

1. **Destination**
"We're going to Paris."
2. **What time it is**
"It's a quarter to 2."
3. **Distance**
"It's about ten miles from my house to the university."
4. **Comparing**
"I prefer sleeping to working."
5. **Giving**
"I gave the book to my sister."
6. **Motive/Reason - with verb**
"I came here to see you."
7. **Separate 2 verbs**
"I want to travel next week"

Use FOR In These Cases:

1. **Benefits**
"Yogurt is good for your digestion."
2. **Period of time**
"We've lived here for 2 years."
3. **Schedule**
"I made an appointment for May 3."
4. **Agree with**
"Are you for or against the development of nuclear weapons?"
5. **Doing something to help someone**
"Could you carry these books for me?"
6. **Motive/Reason - with noun**
"Let's go out for a drink."
7. **Function - with verb (-ing form)**
"A ladle is a big spoon used for serving soup."
