**G) What is the difference between a Continental and an English breakfast ?**

In many **European hotels**, you can choose between a continental and a full English breakfast. **The continental breakfast is cold** (apart from toast). **English breakfast is cooked** (= un plat cuisiné) and it includes a cold buffet.

\_\_\_\_\_ : people often eat this sort of breakfast on Sunday morning and during the holidays. It's composed of: a fruit juice or a fruit ; a bowl of cereal ; baked beans with bacon and eggs ; tea (or milk) with toasts and marmalade.

\_\_\_\_\_ : people eat this sort of breakfast every morning. It's composed of a cup of coffee/tea (or hot chocolate), bread with butter and jam (or honey), sometimes a croissant. It is often served with a fruit juice and sometimes with ham, cheese, yogurt or cereals.
