

1st Conditional

We use it to express Cause and Effect about future situations that we believe are real or possible.

Clause Cause, Effect

If + present simple, will + infinitive.

If it doesn't rain tomorrow, we'll go to the beach.

We'll go to the beach if it doesn't rain tomorrow.

1st Conditional

If + present simple, will + v. base.

If she plays with fire, she will burn.

If you don't brush your teeth, you will get cavities.

Will + v. base if + present simple

She will burn if she plays with fire.

You will get cavities if you don't brush your teeth
