Also, since in South India one minute it's sunny and the next it's raining, especially during the summer months, you need to pack some waterproof clothes and an umbrella, too!
- You mustn't stand too close to Indian people because it is rude. Also, remember that Indians never hug or kiss their friends in public!
- Finally, India is full of colors, and amazing images you will want to remember. However, you must always ask for permission before you photograph something or someone; in some places you are not allowed to take photos.
