U.K. Prime Minister Boris Johnson praised the 3) \_\_\_\_\_ among the Group of Seven nations leaders as they wrapped up their three-day summit on Sunday.

The leaders pledged to share more than 1 4) \_\_\_\_\_ COVID vaccine doses with poorer nations, vowed to help developing countries grow their economies while 5) \_\_\_\_\_ climate change and agreed to back a minimum 6) \_\_\_\_\_ on multinational firms.

They also agreed to 7) \_\_\_\_\_ China's "non-market economic practices" and call out Beijing for human rights 8) \_\_\_\_\_ in Xinjiang and Hong Kong.
