**S:** \_\_\_\_\_ a laundry room in the building?

**L:** Yes. \_\_\_\_\_ washers and dryers in the basement.

**S:** How much is the rent?

**L:** It's \$850 a month.

**S:** Is it possible to visit the apartment?

**L:** Yes, how about tomorrow at 6 o'clock?

**S:** Perfect. Thank you.

**S:** Ok, see you. Bye.
