Type 1	in the future (tomorrow, etc.)	
	if clause	result clause
	Present Simple	will / won't
	If it rains,	I will take an umbrella.
	If it doesn't rain,	I will walk in the park.

  

	If it rains,	I won't walk in the park.
	If it doesn't rain,	I won't take an umbrella.

## First conditional:

We use first conditional when we talk about future situations we believe are real or possible.
