

PAST TENSE - LEARNING THE VERBS

1. Read

We use the **past** to talk about things we did in the past.
(*Usamos el pasado simple para hablar de cosas que hicimos en el pasado*)

In english, we have two types of verbs (*En inglés, tenemos dos tipos de verbos*):

- Regular verbs: turn them to past by adding -ed. (*Los convertimos a pasado añadiendo -ed al final*).
For example: *lik**ed**, play**ed**, start**ed**, cook**ed**...*
- Irregular verbs: the form of the verb changes (*La forma del verbo cambia*) For example:

TRANSLATION	PRESENT	PAST
Comer	Eat	Ate
Beber	Drink	Drank
Ir	Go	Went
Tener/Haber	Have	Had
Hacer	Make	made
Poner	Put	Put
Ver	See	Saw

For the negative, we don't change the main verb. We use **didn't** instead. (*Para la forma negativa, no cambiamos el verbo principal. En lugar de ello, utilizamos didn't*). For example:

*I **didn't** go to the party - No fui a la fiesta*

*I **went** to the party - Fui a la fiesta*
