<p>ADVISE: He advised me to change my diet.</p> <p>ASK: They asked him to resign.</p> <p>BEG: He begged me to forgive him.</p> <p>CONVINCE: He convinced me to take the job.</p> <p>ENCOURAGE: We encouraged her to continue.</p> <p>FORBID: They forbade me to go out.</p> <p>INVITE: She invited us to be at the meeting.</p> <p>ORDER: The judge ordered him to sit down.</p> <p>PERSUADE: She persuaded me to sign up.</p> <p>RECOMMEND: I recommend you to go.</p> <p>REMINDE: Can you remind me to lock the door?</p> <p>TELL: Nobody told me to be quiet.</p> <p>WARN: He warned us not to drink the water.</p>	<p>ACCUSE SB OF: They accused me of cheating.</p> <p>*ADMIT: She admitted making a mistake.</p> <p>APOLOGISE (TO SB) FOR: He apologised (to her) for not calling.</p> <p>*COMPLAIN ABOUT: He complained about being insulted.</p> <p>*CONFESS TO: I confessed to murder </p> <p>*DENY: They denied doing anything wrong.</p> <p>*INSIST ON: She insisted on calling a taxi.</p> <p>*REGRET: I regret not paying more attention.</p> <p>*SUGGEST: I suggest doing some research first.</p>
