
FAMOUS EXPLORERS

Manuel Antonio Mesones Muro (16 June 1862 – 28 October 1930), was a Peruvian pioneer in the exploration of north-eastern Peru, and a scientist of many talents: a natural historian, geographer, historian, geologist, archaeologist and linguist. He found a route through the Andes to link the forested interior of Peru with the Pacific Ocean.



Roald Amundsen was born on July 16, 1872 in Borge, Norway. He was the first explorer to reach the South Pole in 1911. Amundsen's expedition benefited from careful preparation. He included a lot of goods and equipment.

Robert Edwin Peary was an American explorer who led the first expedition to the North Pole. In 1909, Robert Peary, Mathew Henson and four Eskimos were the first people to reach the North Pole.
