

Future Tenses: will or be going to?

Will/Won't + infinitive	(am/is/are) + going to + infinitive
* for predictions (no evidence) * for decisions of the moment * for promises, offers and requests.	* for predictions (WITH evidence) * for plans and intentions

1. Look at that man on the ladder!! He (FALL)
2. I think he (BE) the next President of the United States.
3. "Why are you holding a piece of paper?" "I (WRITE) a letter to my friends back home in Manchester"
4. "Where is Tim going to meet us?" "I think he (WAIT) for us at the station".
5. I'm about to fall asleep after so many hours on the computer. I (HAVE) another cup of coffee. That (WAKE) me up
6. We are so excited about our trip to France. We (VISIT) Paris, Nice and Grenoble
7. Drive faster! If you don't hurry up, she (HAVE) the baby before we get to the hospital!
8. "I can't hear the television!" "I (TURN) it up so you can hear it. We (NOT MAKE) any more noise, we promise"
9. They are making a lot of noise. They (WAKE) the baby up
10. "Would you like something to drink?" "I (HAVE) a cup of tea, please"
11. "There's something wrong with Rocky" "Oh, poor thing, I (TAKE) him to the vet"
12. I (VISIT) the Grand Canyon and San Francisco when I travel to the United States.
13. People (LIVE) in underwater cities in the future
