

Future Tenses: will or be going to?

Will/Won't + infinitive	(am/is/are) + going to + infinitive
* for predictions (no evidence) * for decisions of the moment * for promises, offers and requests.	* for predictions (WITH evidence) * for plans and intentions

- Look at that man on the ladder!! He(FALL)
- I think he (BE) the next President of the United States.
- "Why are you holding a piece of paper?" "I (WRITE) a letter to my friends back home in Manchester"
- "Where is Tim going to meet us?" "I think he(WAIT) for us at the station".
- I'm about to fall asleep after so many hours on the computer. I (HAVE) another cup of coffee. That (WAKE) me up
- We are so excited about our trip to France. We (VISIT) Paris, Nice and Grenoble
- Drive faster! If you don't hurry up, she(HAVE) the baby before we get to the hospital!
- "I can't hear the television!" "I (TURN) it up so you can hear it. We(NOT MAKE) any more noise, we promise"
- They are making a lot of noise. They (WAKE) the baby up
- "Would you like something to drink?" "I (HAVE) a cup of tea, please"
- "There's something wrong with Rocky" "Oh, poor thing, I (TAKE) him to the vet"
- I (VISIT) the Grand Canyon and San Francisco when I travel to the United States.
- People (LIVE) in underwater cities in the future
