Present simple.

Affirmative sentences

subject + verb (same as infinitive)

I live here.
You live here.
we live here
they live here

3rd person singular: subject + verb (+ -s or -es)

He lives here.
She lives here.
It lives here.

Verbs ending in S-H-O-X; add -es

she watches TV

Affirmative: SUBJECT + BASE FORM -ed				Affirmative: SUBJECT + 2nd FORM			
EX. I / you / he / she / it / we / they played football yesterday				EX. I / you / he / she / it / we / they went to the cinema			

AFFIRMATIVE: REGULAR

- To form the past simple we add **-ED** to the infinitive.
- All persons have the same form:
I / you / we / they / walk**+ed**
He she / it play**+ed**
- Spelling changes
 - ☐ Verbs ending in cons-y → **ied**
I study → I studi**ed**
 - ☐ Monosyllables verbs (CVC) → double the consonant
He stops → He stop**ped**
 - ☐ Verbs ending in -e → **d**
She dances → She danc**ed**

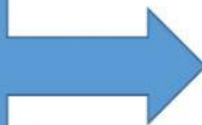
