

# BE + adverbs of frequency

## Example 1:

Ana: Where's Julie?

Bob: Oh, she's usually late.

Ana: Who's first?

Bob: Not you! You're always first!

## Example 2:

Carl: Let's have a barbecue!

Sue: Okay, let's do it at my house.

Carl: But it's always in your house!

**For negatives, we usually use always, usually and often.**

## Example 3:

Sam: What's wrong?

Ellen: I don't know, I'm not usually this tired. = I'm seldom this tired.



## SUBJECT + BE + ADVERB
