WAKE UP



MEANING:

To stop sleeping and open your eyes.

EXAMPLES:

- I **wake up** at 7 o'clock.
- My alarm clock rang and I **woke up** immediately.

GET UP



MEANING:

To get out of bed, usually to start your day.

EXAMPLES:

- I normally **get up** at 7.45
- I have to **get up** early tomorrow because it will be a busy day.
- I **wake up** at 6 and then **get up** five minutes later.

Sleep in

Sleep longer than wanted

They usually **sleep in** on Saturday mornings.

Lie down

Rest on your back

She **lay down** on the bedroom and soon fell asleep.

Wake up

Stop sleeping, or make someone stop sleeping

They often **wake up** at 7. am.

Sleep over

Sleep at a friend's house

Our sister is having a **sleep over** for her friends tomorrow.

Get up

Stop sleeping and leave bed

I first thing I do when I **get up** is go to the toilet.

Doze off

Go to sleep, especially when you did not intend to

I closed my eyes for a minute and must have **dozed off**.

Drop off

Fall asleep easily, without intending to

He kept **dropping off** at his desk.

Sleep through

Cause liquid to evaporate completely boiling

I can't believe you **slept through** my recital Dad!



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
