



Verb: **STAND**

Stand means: have or maintain an upright position, supported by one's feet

V1	V2	V3
Stand	Stood	Stood

Synonym Words For **STAND**

- erect • rise • mount • be vertical
- locate • set • poise
- place • settle • position
- put • cock • be erect
- rank • dispose • be on feet

Examples

- Who **stood**?
- I can hardly **stand**.
- Samuel **stood** up again.
- Don't **stand** in my way.
- Alex **stood** up suddenly.

PHRASAL VERBS WITH STAND

Stand out

Be obvious or conspicuous, in contrast to one's surroundings

E.g. Tourist guides often carry umbrellas so that they **stand out** in a crowd.



Stand up

Bring something up and set it into a standing position

E.g. Laura **stood** the sofa **up** on end.



Stand in for

Stand back

Maintain a safe distance from a hazard

E.g. You had better **stand** **back** and let me operate the chainsaw.
