

Speak means: say something in order to convey information or an opinion

• voice	• blab	• express	• enunciate


Examples

- They must **speak**.
- I can **speak** English fluently.
 - They **spoke** quietly.
- She can **speak** Spanish, too.
- Please **speak** in a low voice.

PHRASAL VERBS WITH SPEAK

Speak for	Speak on somebody's behalf	E.g. I think I speak for the whole group when I say that we're glad you came.
Speak for	Represent an intrinsic quality	E.g. You really do deserve to be published - your recent articles speak for themselves.
Speak for oneself	Provide an opinion only on one's own behalf	E.g. I'm here speaking for myself, not for my company.
Speak of	Bespeak; show; indicate; foretell; suggest	E.g. This act speaks of his kindness.

Phrasal Verbs for ENVIRONMENT



Wipe out

To destroy something completely

People worry that climate change **will wipe out** coffee crops in certain countries.



Use up

Finish a supply of something

I've used up all my holiday entitlement.

Throw away

To discard an item that is no longer useful

Consumers **throw away** around 50 billion plastic bags annually.

Cut down

Kill trees

African forests **is being cut down**.

Break down

To decompose

Plastics don't **break down** quickly.

Run out of

Finish the supply of something

We'll **run out of** air long before we need food and water.

Die out

Stop existing

This animal will **die out** before long.
