

	Who works with people with physical, mental or social disabilities to help do everyday activities such as with physical rehabilitation or equipment for daily living.
	Who's responsible for the day to day running of the organisation, ensuring it meets standards and managing budgets and contracts.
	The first person who welcomes and <u>helps</u> visitors and answers the phone.
	Who offers counselling and advocacy to individuals and families, and intervene where vulnerable people need safeguarding.
	Who organises social activities for people who need care and support, including trips out, entertainment and supporting people

	to take part.
	One who treats people with mental disorders or problems.
	Who performs clinical tasks to people in a nursing home or in the community.
	A person who cooks food or whose job is cooking.
	A person who helps people who are disabled or chronically ill with their activities of daily living. The task is sometimes unpaid and is carried out by family or friends.
	Who evaluates a person's ability to express oneself (speech, written, or otherwise expressed) and comprehend what is seen or heard. A speech/language pathologist trains a person to use assistive technology as an alternative form of communication if the person is unable to verbalize.
