CLASSICAL MUSICAL PRODIGIES



Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart was a famous Austrian composer. Mozart had learned to play the harpsichord, an instrument similar to the piano, when he was only three years old and had composed his first piece of music by the age of five. By the time he was a teenager, the musical genius had already written symphonies, operas and sonatas. Mozart traveled throughout Europe playing for royal families and in public concerts, impressing people with his amazing talent. He could compose music in his head and then play it before writing it down. Mozart's lifestyle was extravagant, and he began having financial problems in his mid-twenties. Fortunately, he was a prolific composer and had written more than 600 musical works by the time of his early death in Vienna at the age of 35.



Ludwig Van Beethoven

Ludwig Van Beethoven was born in Bonn, Germany in 1770. He started taking piano and violin lessons at the age of four and by the age of eleven, he could write music. By the time he turned twelve, he was able to conduct an orchestra. Beethoven was an excellent pianist, but he started to lose his hearing in his 20s and had to end his career. At first, he couldn't hear the orchestra well, but as time went by, couldn't even hear himself playing. He also found it difficult to carry on conversations with other people because he could hardly hear a word they said. Nevertheless, Beethoven continued writing his compositions by listening to the music in his head. Before his death in 1827, Beethoven had composed symphonies, concertos and piano sonatas. He is considered one of the greatest composers of all times.
