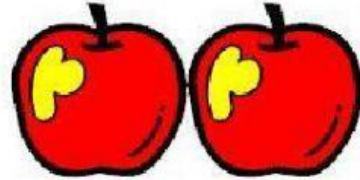


PLURAL RULE ONE

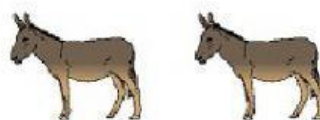

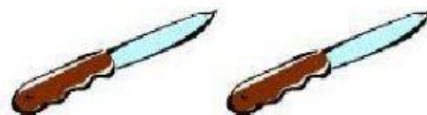
