Ask after	the act or process of ending the operations of a business, system, industry, etc. either temporarily or permanently
Back out	To continue an activity or task
Bring up	to understand, especially after a long time
Call for	to do something you did not have time to do earlier
Call off	to change your opinion of something
Check up	to decide not to do something that you had said you would do
Carry on	the act of stopping something
Catch on	to demand that something happens
Catch up	a medical examination to test your general state of health
Close down	the activity of trying to do as well as a competitor or of trying to reach a level of achievement
Come around	to become fashionable or popular
Come into	to ask for information about someone, especially about their health
Coming on	To receive something as a result of the death of a relative
Come up with	to decide that something that has already been planned will not happen
Cut down on	Something that is blocked
Cut off	to do or use less of something
Cut on	to start to talk about or mention for the first time a particular subject
Look after	to take care of or be in charge of something
Take after	to suggest or think of an idea or plan
