Students are able to use and apply **COMPARATIVE ADJECTIVES** to compare two things identifying short and long adjectives; describe and compare places.

GRAMMAR: Comparative Adjectives

Adjectives with one syllable : add '-er' or '-r'	<ul style="list-style-type: none">cold – coldernice – nicer	"In Canada, winter is colder than summer."
Adjectives with two or more syllables : add 'more'	<ul style="list-style-type: none">honest – more honestexpensive – more expensive	"Milk is more expensive than water."
Adjectives with two syllables – that end in 'y' : change 'y' to 'i' and add '-er'	<ul style="list-style-type: none">early – earlierhappy – happier	"I arrived at school earlier than my classmates."
Adjectives that end with a vowel and a consonant , double the final letter.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">big - biggerhot – hotter	"Brazil is bigger than Singapore."

Note: Be careful to spell "than" correctly. Don't misspell "than" (correct) and write "then" (incorrect).
