	In some neighborhoods, schools organize parades. In these parades, students wear special clothes of different colors. Sometimes school bands play instruments and walk on the streets of the neighborhoods. These marches promote creativity.	
	In some neighborhoods, the local church asks neighbors to wear costumes related to the story of Jesus' crucifixion. The neighbors represent the role of Jesus or Virgin Mary. People usually walk behind the main characters, and they usually pray. These processions promote spiritual values such as sacrifice, honesty, and faith.	
	Some families or friends often go to play this traditional game. A person throws a metal disc called "Tejo" to a "mecha" which is a small triangle - shaped envelope full of gunpowder. The player should hit the target from about 20 meters away. People enjoy and feel relaxed playing this game because it is a tradition that helps them develop a physical skill.	
	Some neighbors organize bazaars to collect money. They sometimes have special reasons to collect money for instance, they want to do a celebration with the money, they want to help the needy or they want to go on a trip. This tradition promotes teamwork.	
	Some families usually go to the local street market to buy vegetables and fruit. They can find all kinds of fresh food there. In this market, food can be cheaper than in other markets.
