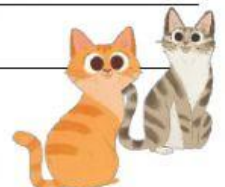
Money : International Currency

Get to know!!! Britain's national currency is the pound sterling (symbol: £), which is sub-divided into 100 pence (symbol: p). You get notes in denominations of £50, £20, £10 and £5, and coins in £2, £1, 50p, 20p, 10p, 5p, 2p and 1p.

When we write amounts of money in figures, the pound symbol £ is always shown in front of the figures. **For example:** 'three hundred pounds' --- > '£300'.

If an amount of money consists only of pence, we put the letter 'p' after the figures.

For example: 20p is often pronounced "twenty pee" rather than "twenty pence". The singular of pence is "penny".

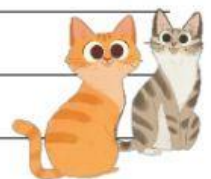
