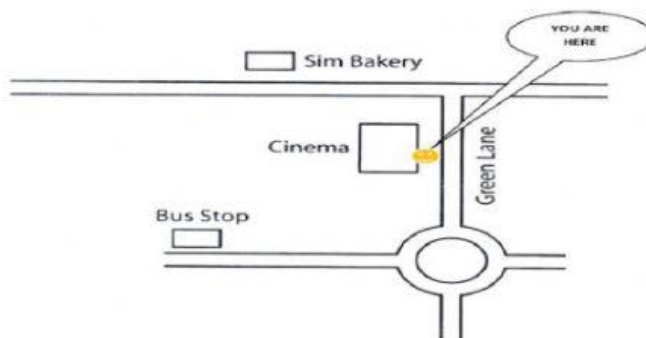
Yellowstone National Park is..... *

ISTANA BUDAYA

Istana Budaya, also known as Palace of Culture is situated in the heart of Kuala Lumpur. The idea of this theatre was initiated in 1964. The construction began in 1995 and took three years to complete. Istana Budaya was officiated by the Prime Minister of Malaysia Tun Dr. Mahathir Mohamad.

The cost to build Istana Budaya was RM 210 million. The elegant building was designed by our own architect, Mr. Muhammad Kamar Ya'akub. He has successfully created a masterpiece which attracts millions of tourists every year. Istana Budaya is also rated among the ten most sophisticated theatres in the world together with the famous Royal Albert Hall in London.

The main auditorium could fit 1412 people at one time. Istana Budaya aims to raise the standard of performing arts, making high-quality theatre productions more popular and also attracting higher senses of artistic appreciation. It is the home to Residence Artists (Dance), the National Symphony Orchestra and Orchestra Traditional Malaysia.

The most interesting part of Istana Budaya is its design. The influence of Malay traditional house can be seen in its architectural design. Similar to a Malay traditional house, it is divided into three sections; the *Serambi* (lobby and foyer), the *rumah ibu* (auditorium) and the *rumah dapur* (kitchen) which includes the stage and rehearsal hall. In addition, the interior was constructed using local resources.
