have / has + past participle

Already = ya

Ever = alguna vez

Yet= aún, todavía

Just = recién

Never = nunca

I have eaten lunch.



I have just eaten lunch. (Recién he comido)

I have never eaten sushi. (Nunca he comido sushi)

\* yet            ?        Have you eaten lunch yet?

No, I haven't

—        I haven't eaten lunch yet.

Todavía no he comido.

\* ever            ?        Have you ever eaten sushi?

No, I haven't (No, I have never eaten sushi)

-        I haven't ever eaten sushi.
