

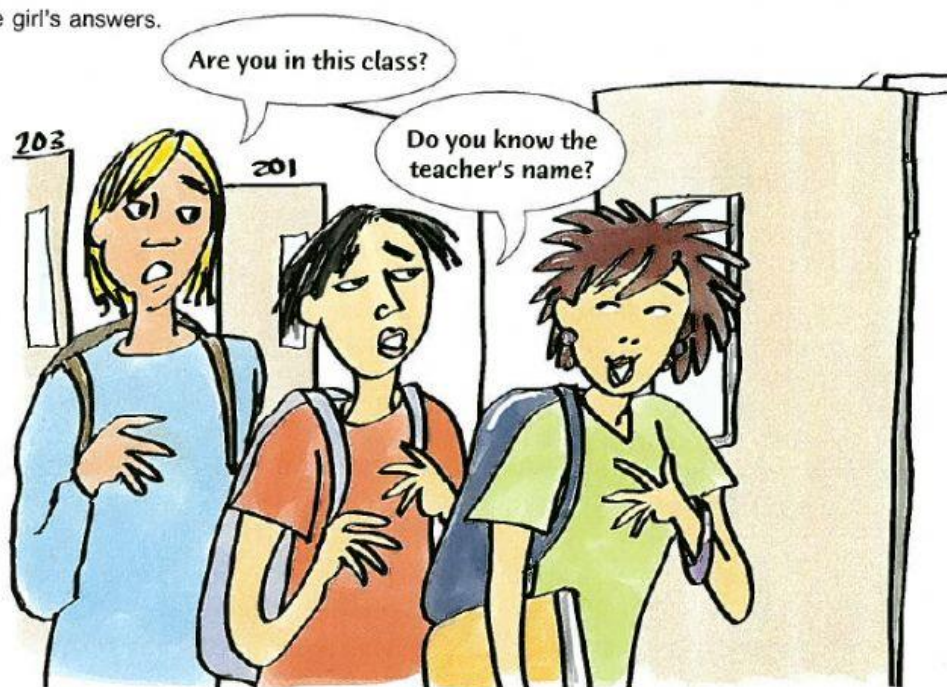

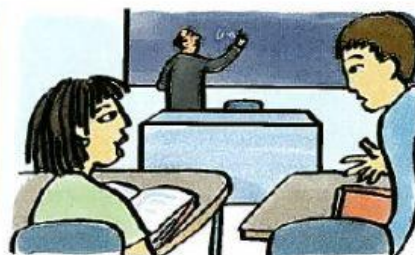


Listen to the following conversation. Then practice it with a partner.

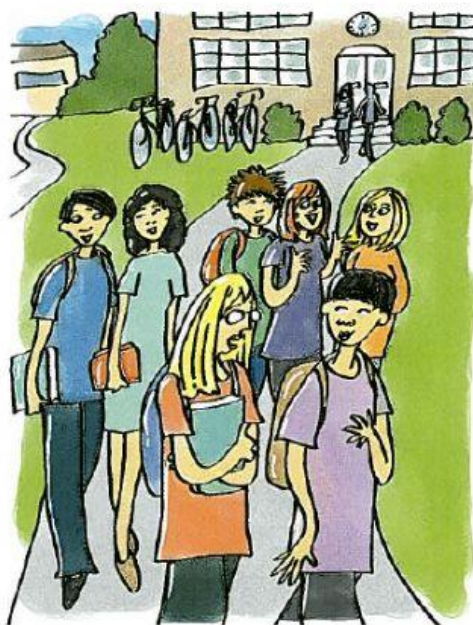
