Shakespeare was born in Stratford-Upon-Avon, a small town in England, in 1564. He went to school there, but he didn't go to university - his family wasn't rich, and university was expensive in those days.

Shakespeare got married when he was only eighteen. About ten years later, he left Stratford and travelled to London: he wanted to be an actor, and all the important theatres were in London.
