AS - (1) function / role
(2) similarity in action or situation
(3) + preposition
(4) + if
(5) object + as after certain verbs: regard, define, describe, etc.
(6) = because
(7) = while / just when
(8) after **as** or **so** = the same degree or extent

LIKE - (9) similarity in people and things
(10) metaphorical comparisons
