We use the third conditional to: \_\_\_\_\_

1. talk about hypothetical or imaginary situations in the present or the future.
2. speculate about how past actions or events could have been different. we are talking about hypothetical actions and results that did not happen.
3. To talk about something that might happen in the future

The structure of third conditional is: \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_

1. IF + (Past Perfect Clause) , ... WOULD + HAVE + (Past Participle)
2. IF + (Past Simple Clause) , ... WOULD + (Present simple)
3. IF + (Present Simple) , ... WILL +(Present simple)
4. ... WOULD + HAVE + (Past Participle) IF + (Past Perfect Clause)
