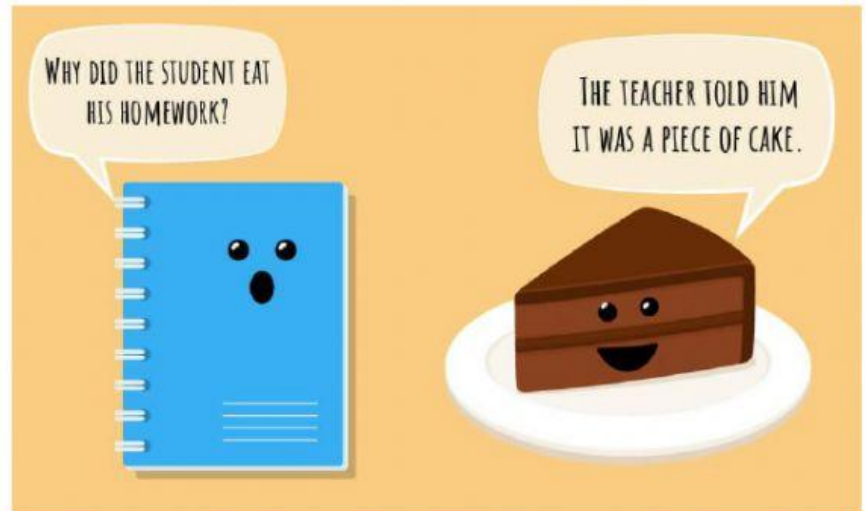


3- Speaking and writing skills. Homophones. The same, but not the same.

Homophones are words that sound the same but they don’t have the same meaning. Like “be” /bi/ (ser o estar) and “bee” /bii/ (abeja)

Antonyms are words that have opposite meaning. Like “dark” and “light”
