Comparatives and superlatives

Remember that:

- with short adjectives we add *-er* or *-est*.
✓ Take the train, it's **cheaper**.
✗ ... it's **more cheaper**.
✓ The morning is the **busiest** time.
✗ ... is the **most busy** time.
- with long adjectives we use **more** or **the most**.
✓ He's **more intelligent** than his brother.
✗ He's **intelligenter**
✓ It's the **most beautiful** area of the city.
✗ It's the **beautifullest**

- we use **in** + a room.
✓ We'll meet **in the classroom**.
✗ We'll meet **at**
- we use **on** + a wall.
✓ There are lots of **pictures on the walls**.
✗ There are lots of **pictures in**
- we use **on** + a table or a desk.
✓ There's a **lamp on the table** by my bed.
✗ There's a **lamp #**

Adjective or adverb?

Remember that:

- we use an **adverb** to describe a verb or an action.
✓ *I ran quickly to get help.* ✗ *I ran quick ...*
- we use an **adjective** to describe a noun.
✓ *It's a quiet place to work.* ✗ *It's a quietly place ...*
- we use an **adjective** after **be** in the imperative.
✓ *Be careful!* ✗ *Be carefully!*
